AMY M. DOYE

Ms. Amy Doye is the Deputy Director, 6th Mission Support Group, 6th Air Refueling Wing, MacDill Air Force Base, Florida. As Deputy Director, she provides support to more than 2,200 people assigned to six squadrons, and supports U.S. Special Operations Command, U.S. Central Command, and 31 other mission partners. She is the focal point for the plans, programs and services necessary to maintain 658 facilities and support a base population of 13,000 military and civilians, and over 250,000 retirees. She is accountable for an operating budget of \$50 million and annually supervises more than \$57 million in military construction, more than \$9 million in service contracts and approximately \$140 million in retail sales. Additionally, she is accountable for environmental & natural resource programs on a 5,700-acre USAF Base.

Ms. Doye, a native of Yorktown, VA, began her career with the Department of the Air Force in 2004 through a cooperative education program with the 1st Civil Engineer Squadron at Langley Air Force Base. After graduating from Virginia Tech with a Bachelor of Science in Civil and Environmental Engineering, she



continued her career serving in a variety of civil engineer positions at the squadron, major command and headquarters level. She is a registered professional engineer in the state of Virginia. Prior to her current position, Ms. Doye served as the Military Construction Program Manager at Headquarters Air Force. In this role, she provided policy and oversight of an \$11.5 billion program providing support to Combatant Commanders, new mission platform beddowns, and recapitalization of aging infrastructure.
